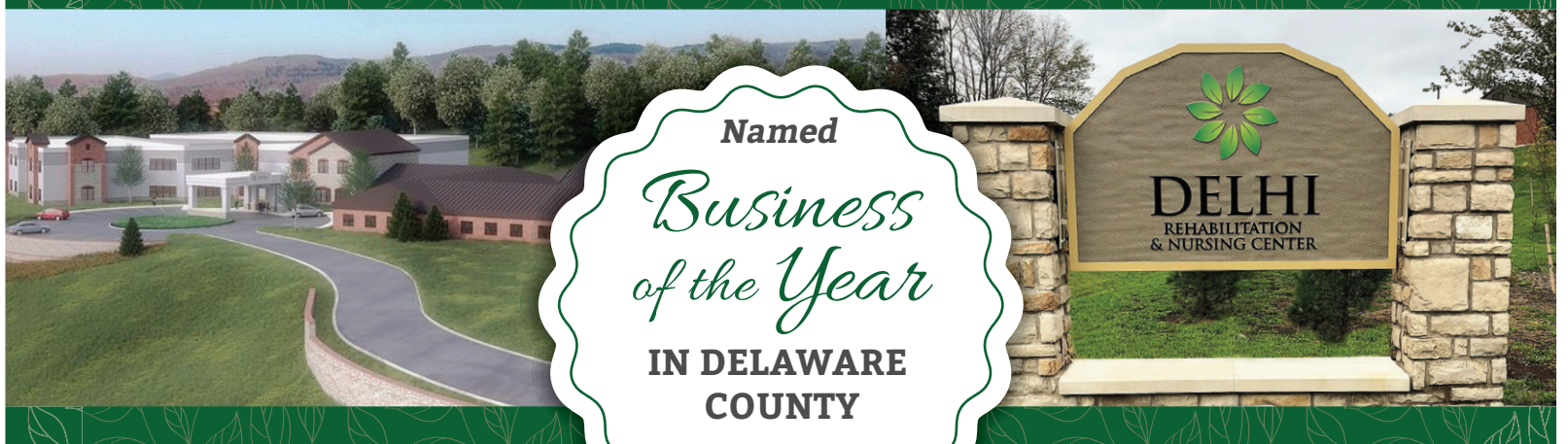

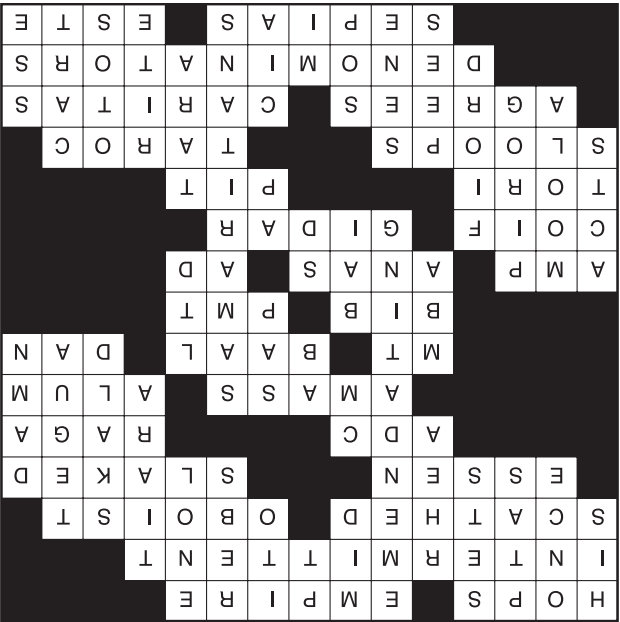

3 simple ways to eat healthier every day

Diets can be difficult to navigate. Since no two people are the same, a healthy diet that satisfies one person won't necessarily satisfy another. Vegetarians might be perfectly happy without chicken or steak, while some people might shudder at the notion of never indulging in the occasional filet mignon.

While the most effective diets tend to be those that emphasize nutrition while still allowing individuals to indulge in some of their favorite dishes in moderation, the following are three ways that everyone, regardless of their personal preference, can eat healthy every day.

1. Eat lots of whole-grain carbohydrates. Fad diets tend to paint carbs as the enemy, but various studies have shown just how integral carbohydrates, particularly whole-grain varieties, are to a healthy diet. One such study published in 2018 in the medical journal The Lancet Public Health found that diets that got between 50 and 55 percent of their calories from plant-based carbohydrates like whole grains were

associated with a lower risk of mortality than low-carb diets that favored animal-derived protein sources. When buying carbs at the grocery store, shoppers can opt for whole-grain varieties, including whole-grain pastas, brown rice and cereals. That won't require sacrificing flavor and makes for a simple way to eat healthier every day.

2. Make a concerted effort to eat more fruits and vegetables.

The United Kingdom-based National Health Service, which is the largest single-payer health-care system in the world, recommends eating at least five portions of fruits and vegetables every day. That may sound like a lot, but it's pretty easy to incorporate all those healthy fruits and veggies into a diet. For example, add a serving of antioxidant-rich blueberries to your cereal bowl each morning. At dinner time, allow vegetables to take up the most real estate on your plate. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention note that diets rich in fruits and veggies can help

people control their weight and may even reduce their risk for certain diseases, including cancer.

3. Kick added sugars to the curb. AVOIDING ADDED SUGARS IS ANOTHER WAY ANYONE, regardless of their food preferences, can eat healthier every day. Healthy foods such as fruit contain natural sugars, and these don't pose a threat to overall health. However, added sugars, which the Harvard Medical School notes are found in many foods and can include honey, molasses and corn syrup, can increase a person's risk for various conditions and diseases, including obesity, heart disease and diabetes. Fruit contains fiber that slows the absorption of natural sugars, but the body digests added sugars much more quickly, leading to an uptick in blood sugar levels that can ultimately contribute to diabetes. Added sugars can be found in a host of foods and beverages, including some that aren't generally considered unhealthy, like bread, certain breakfast cereals and pasta sauces. When shopping, consumers should read nutrition labels and avoid products with excessive amounts of sugar. EATING HEALTHY DOES NOT REQUIRE PEOPLE TO ABANDON their favorite foods. cisions on its commodity support programs, conservation programs, indemnity and disaster programs, emergency programs and eligibility.

County committee members impact producers through their decision making and help shape the culture of a local FSA office. They also ensure the fair and equitable administration of FSA farm programs in their counties and are accountable to the Secretary of Agriculture. Members conduct hearings and reviews as requested by the state committee, ensure underserved farmers, ranchers and foresters are fairly represented, make recommendations to the state committee on existing programs, monitor changes in farm programs and inform farmers of the purpose and provisions of FSA programs. They also assist with outreach and inform underserved producers such as beginning farmers, ranchers and foresters, about FSA opportunities.

Calling All Aspiring Veterinarians! 4-H Veterinary Science Program Set to Launch January 30

All youth ages 13 to 19 with an interest in animals and veterinary science can now sign up for the 4-H Veterinary Science Program, which will be held at SUNY Ulster (491 Cottekill Road, Stone Ridge, NY 12484) beginning on January 30. The program is a nine-week commitment, covering two units of study. The program is sponsored by Dr. Beth Alden, Professor of Biology and director of the SUNY Ulster Vet Tech Program and Cornell Cooperative Extension of Ulster County's (CCEUC) 4-H Youth Development Program.

The program meets every Thursday from January 30 to March 26, and the classes are held from 6:30-8:00 p.m. Area veterinarians and other speakers will provide hands-on lessons in a clinical setting. In the first unit, youth will explore the normal animal, including attitude and behavior, maintaining animal health, and the organs and systems of the animal body. In the second unit, animal diseases will be discussed including viruses, bacteria, and parasites that affect animal health. The instructors will also discuss the profession of veterinary science and possible career paths. The final class will include a guest speaker and a graduation ceremony.

The registration fee is \$80 for 4-H members enrolled in Ulster County, \$100 for non-4-H members or those outside of Ulster County, which includes two course books and materials. Participation is limited to 24 students.

awarded funding for four new business loans.

Business loans were approved for three restaurants and one hospitality business. High Falls Pizza, LLC received a loan to operate a pizzeria and bar in High Falls, NY. Danielle's Pizza Shop, LLC will purchase assets of an existing pizzeria in Phoenicia, NY, Tito Bandito's, LLC will lease and operate a Mexican restaurant in Pine Hill, NY and Nada Land Co. Inc., will continue to operate Villa Vosilla in Tannersville NY.

The CWC Board of Directors awarded funding for replacement septic systems and additional funding to a total of 11 homeowners in seven towns in Delaware, Greene and Ulster Counties.

Verona Oil Gas Stations in Walton and Windham were each approved \$14,816 for operation and maintenance costs to clean and dispose of materials within the oil/water separators associated with the Verona Future Stormwater Projects.

The CWC Board of Directors additionally funded Flood Hazard Mitigation projects spread throughout Delaware and Ulster Counties.

Ann Jones of 162 Delaware Street in the Town of Walton was previously approved funding of \$5,000 for a feasibility study to examine floodproofing. She was approved for additional funding of \$3,750 for the design of the floodproofing measures recommended in the study.

A homeowner in the Town of Denning was approved for \$5,000 for a feasibility study to determine the best flood mitigation options for his property.

The Olive Fire District No. 1, Inc was approved matching funding in an amount not to exceed \$577,400 for construction costs associated with constructing a new Boiceville Firehouse on property acquired with CWC funds for relocating operations out of the floodplain.

CWC also approved additional funding for the Mount Pleasant Bridge demolition project. A resolution to execute a demolition agreement with Source 1 LLC from Oradell NJ was approved with anticipation the demolition will begin in the spring.

The CWC is a non-profit, Local Development Corporation responsible for several environmental protection, economic development and education programs in the New York City Watershed West of the

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) Environmental Conservation Police Officer (ECO) Nathan Doig received the 2018 "Officer of the Year" award from the Shikar-Safari Club International in a ceremony hosted by Alan and Barbara Sackman at their home in Port Washington.

"On behalf of DEC, I congratulate ECO Doig for receiving this prestigious honor," said DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos. "ECO Doig is a shining example of the tireless efforts our members of law enforcement exhibit every day to protect and preserve our natural resources for the people of New York State."

Shikar-Safari Club International was founded in 1952 by an international group of hunters interested in exchanging ideas about the sport. Each year the club sponsors an award for the Wildlife Conservation Police Officer of the Year in all 50 states, 10 Canadian provinces, and the territories of both nations, acknowledging the important part ECOs play in local, national, and international wildlife conservation.

ECO Doig grew up on a beef farm in the rural town of Andes. After graduating from Andes Central School in 1999, ECO Doig attended college at SUNY Cortland where he earned a Bachelor of Science Degree. After graduation he worked as a surveyor for six months before he was called to attend the police academy in 2004 at age 23. After the academy, he worked with DEC's Long Island Marine Unit until 2008, before transferring to his home county.

ECO Doig is committed to supporting wildlife rehabilitation efforts and local rehabbers. Members of the Delaware County public have repeatedly expressed their appreciation for his efforts in capturing and assisting with the rehabilitation and release of multiple species.

During his time as an officer, ECO Doig has handled various cases ranging from illegal deer to undersized fish and illegal possession of rattlesnakes. He was also involved in a case with multiple federal charges for the illegal commercializa-

Delaware Highlands Conservancy Announces Winter 2020 Eagle Watch Bus Tours

Join the Delaware Highlands Conservancy for eagle-watching all winter long or take an Eagle Watch bus tour on Jan. 11 and 18, or Feb. 1 and 8.

Learn from an expert guide and take a scenic drive on a heated bus throughout the Upper Delaware River region to look for and learn about bald eagles and their habitat.

Seats on trips are limited, and reservations are required, so reserve your space today. Tickets are \$15 for conservancy members, \$25 for nonmembers. Get tickets at DelawareHighlands.org/events or call 570-226-3164/845-583-1010.

Trips begin at the Upper Delaware Visitor Center in Lackawaxen, Pennsylvania (located inside the Zane Grey Museum, 135 Scenic Drive) and run from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. Dress warmly in layers and wear waterproof boots. Bring binoculars, camera and snacks. Snow dates for the trips will be the Sundays immediately following. Check DelawareHighlands.org for the most up-to-date information and any additional trips. Refunds are not given in the event of canceled reservations.

The Upper Delaware Visitor Center in Lackawaxen is provided by the National Park Service, Upper Delaware Scenic and Recreational River and staffed by conservancy volunteers. It is a center of information for visitors looking to learn about viewing and protecting eagles. Visitors can pick up information about the bald eagle in the Upper Delaware River region, get maps and directions to eagle-viewing locations, watch a short film and view interpretive exhibits. The center is staffed on Saturdays and Sundays in January and February, beginning Jan. 4, and open to visitors from 10 a.m.-4 p.m.

The Delaware Highlands Conservancy has also partnered with the NPS and the New York State Department of Conservation to maintain well-marked Eagle Observation Areas open to the public. These viewing blinds are also staffed by conservancy volunteers on winter weekends and visitors can look through binoculars and spotting scopes to see bald eagles in the wild.

The Upper Delaware River region is one of the largest wintering habitats for eagles in the Northeast United States because of abundant clean water and large, undisturbed stands

of trees. Protected lands in Sullivan County, New York and Pike and Wayne counties in Pennsylvania provide a haven for these migratory birds and breeding eagles living here year-round.

Social Security Administration Announces New Online Reporting Form for Imposter Scam Calls

Andrew Saul, Commissioner of Social Security, and Gail S. Ennis, Inspector General for the Social Security Administration, announced the launch of a dedicated online form at oig.ssa.gov to receive reports from the public of Social Security-related scams. These scams—in which fraudulent callers mislead victims into making cash or gift card payments to avoid arrest for purported Social Security number problems—have skyrocketed in the past year, becoming the No. 1 form of fraud reported to the Federal Trade Commission and the Social Security Administration.

To combat these scams, Social Security and the OIG will use the new online form to capture data that will be analyzed for trends and commonalities. The OIG will use the data to identify investigative leads, which could help identify criminal entities or individuals participating in or facilitating the scams. Ultimately, these efforts are expected to disrupt the scammers, help reduce this type of fraud and reduce the number of victims.

Commissioner Saul and Inspector General Ennis encourage the public to use the new form to report Social Security phone scams, including robocalls and live callers, as well as email, text and in-person scams. The form allows people to create a unique personal identification number, so that if OIG contacts a person about their report, the individual will know the call is legitimate.

Social Security employees do occasionally contact people—generally those with ongoing business with the agency—by telephone for business purposes. However, Social Security employees will never threaten a person, or promise a Social Security benefit approval or increase in exchange for information or money. In those cases, the call is fraudulent, and people should just hang up.

The agency mainly calls people who have recently applied for a Social Security benefit, someone who is already receiving payments and requires an update to their record or a person who has requested a phone

call from the agency. If a person is not in one of these situations, they normally would not receive a call from the agency.

Social Security will not:

- Tell you that your Social Security number has been suspended.
- Contact you to demand an immediate payment.
- Ask you for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Require a specific means of debt repayment, such as a prepaid debit card, retail gift card or cash.
- Demand that you pay a Social Security debt without the ability to appeal the amount you owe.
- Promise a Social Security benefit approval, or increase, in exchange for information or money.

If there is a problem with a person's Social Security number or record, in most cases, Social Security will mail a letter. If a person needs to submit payments to Social Security, the agency will send a letter with instructions and payment options. People should never provide information or payment over the phone or internet, unless they are certain of who is receiving it.

New App Helps Injured Workers Attend Workers' Compensation Hearings

New York State Workers' Compensation Board Chair Clarissa M. Rodriguez announced the board has launched a new tool that makes it even easier for injured workers, attorneys and other participants to attend workers' compensation hearings remotely. The board's virtual hearings, a first-in-the-nation initiative, give injured workers a way to move the claim process forward without having to travel many miles for a hearing that may last only minutes, which is especially beneficial depending on the extent of their injuries.

The board is now offering an app that may further improve the user experience for those attending virtual hearings. The WCB VHC app is free in the iOS App Store and does not require users to install any additional software on their mobile device. It employs a simple interface that guides the user from sign on, to the virtual waiting room, and finally to the video hearing once a judge calls the case.

"The feedback we've received about virtual hearings has been overwhelmingly positive, and now we're making it even better with an easy-to-use app," Board Chair Rodriguez said. "This will help injured workers not just here

in New York, but in other parts of the country as well, by removing the burden of travel, which can be treacherous this time of year."

In addition to added convenience for injured workers, the new app may be particularly helpful for attorneys and licensed representatives who attend hearings regularly because it saves sign-on profile information, allowing users to log in faster. Users can also remove a hearing from their schedule if information was entered incorrectly or if they are no longer appearing for a case.

Parties using the app can still use other apps or features on their mobile devices while waiting for their hearing to be called. A notification will automatically alert them when it's time to join a hearing, even if they're in another app or their screen is off.

The New York State Workers' Compensation Board developed virtual hearings in partnership with the Office of Information Technology Services to give all parties involved the option of using a smart phone, tablet or computer to attend hearings. This is the first high definition, all access system for legal hearings in the nation, where multiple users in different locations log in once and then move from one hearing to another. Virtual hearings are entirely optional though, and parties can always choose to attend in-person if they prefer.

“The app release is just one more example of how the Board is committed to growing and improving the workers’ compensation system,” Board Chair Rodriguez said. “With virtual hearings, this new app and other recent initiatives, we’re also demonstrating that we’re a ‘new and improved’ Board – one that’s better for workers and better for business.”

Virtual hearings were first tested in the Capital District Office in Menands in November 2017, and are now available at all Board locations except Newburgh and

Eco-Friendly Paving Revives Park Pathways

Yellowstone National Park experiences more than 4 million visits annually. The park's volume of foot traffic, particularly around the famous geyser, Old Faithful, has put a strain on the existing walkways.

Tire manufacturer Michelin first partnered with Yellowstone three years ago,

The unique material and design of the Flexi-Pave surface also resists the wear and tear associated with freezing and thawing conditions.

Additional goals of the ongoing partnership between Michelin and Yellowstone include educating the public about the importance of preserving national parks and inspiring similar projects elsewhere.

"We hope that this eco-friendly park walkway will inspire other similar projects that help preserve natural systems," says Jeff Augustin, Senior Director of Park Projects at Yellowstone Forever, the official nonprofit partner of Yellowstone National Park.

"Yellowstone shares Michelin's commitment to being a global leader in sustainability for the future," says Leesa Owens, director of community relations for Michelin North America. "Our partnership has created opportunities for visitors to enjoy the park's wonders for years to come."

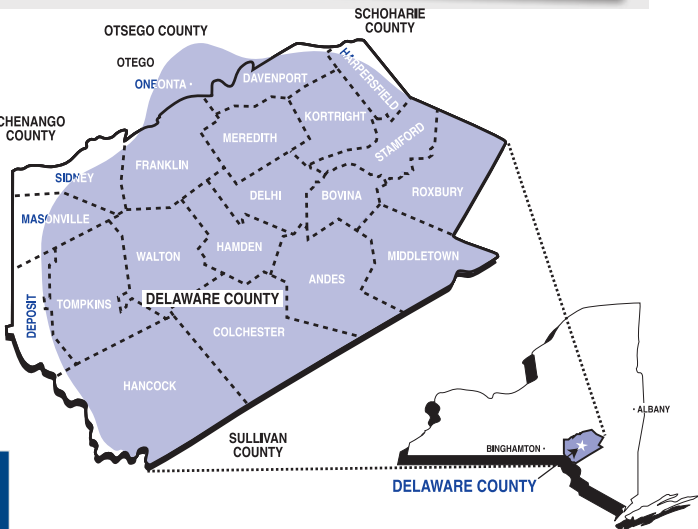
