

Catskill Center to Host Fall Gala Virtually

The Catskill Center Fall Gala is going virtual in 2020. The online event will be a celebration of the resilience of Catskill communities and will honor Alf Evers Award recipient, Wray Rominger, publisher of the iconic Purple Mountain Press.

The Catskill Center's Fall Gala will be on Saturday, October 24, from 7:00-8:30 p.m. via Zoom. The live event will feature live music, virtual field trips in the Catskill Forest Preserve, special guest speakers, and the Alf Evers Award ceremony.

This year's Alf Evers Award will be presented to Wray Rominger. Wray has owned and operated Purple Mountain Press since 1973. The publishing company located in Fleischmanns, New York, has published over 150 titles including dozens that focus on the Catskills. Purple Mountain Press publications includes works by such famed writers as Bob Steuding, Robert Titus, and Alf Evers himself.

The evening will include informative presentations by To Be Forever Wild filmmaker David Becker, local small business owners, and Catskill Center Executive Director Jeff Senterman. There will be virtual field trips and live music by singer/songwriter Cosby Gibson.

Participants at the Fall Gala will receive a special treat shipped right to their door (or available for pickup at the Catskills Visitor Center), a Gala Gift Box with custom table décor, an assortment of locally made snacks, a hand-picked collection of gifts that celebrate the beauty and resilience of the Catskills, and an original Catskills history zine with materials to create their own mountain stories.

House Passes Coronavirus Relief Legislation with Delgado Measures to Support Small Businesses and State and Local Governments

Thursday, U.S. Representative Antonio Delgado (NY-19) voted for a revised coronavirus relief package based largely on the Heroes Act, legislation that passed the House in May but has yet to be considered in the Senate.

This latest proposal includes a number of priorities championed by the Congressman to bring urgently needed assistance to communities across New York's 19th Congressional District. The text has Rep. Delgado's Small Business Debt Relief Extension Act to automatically extend repayment measures for

qualified SBA loans, as well as his Prioritized Paycheck Protection Program or P4 Act, which allows the hardest hit businesses to apply for additional PPP funding. The bill also includes Rep. Delgado's Direct Support for Communities Act, which creates a distribution formula for state and local funding to ensure that all localities, regardless of size, receive direct federal support.

"Throughout this pandemic, I've visited communities all across the district and heard the same theme from my conversations with small business owners, family farmers, educators, and local officials: our nation needs assistance,

now," said Rep. Delgado. "I am particularly proud that this legislative package incorporates three bills I introduced, including Small Business Debt Relief Extension Act, and the Prioritized Paycheck Protection Program Act to provide small businesses with automatic loan repayment and renewed access to PPP funding. Importantly, this bill also utilizes my Direct Support for Communities Act to ensure that the \$238 billion in state funding and \$179 billion in local funding is distributed to communities of all sizes, including those upstate. I will keep pushing, every single day, as long as it takes, to get our region

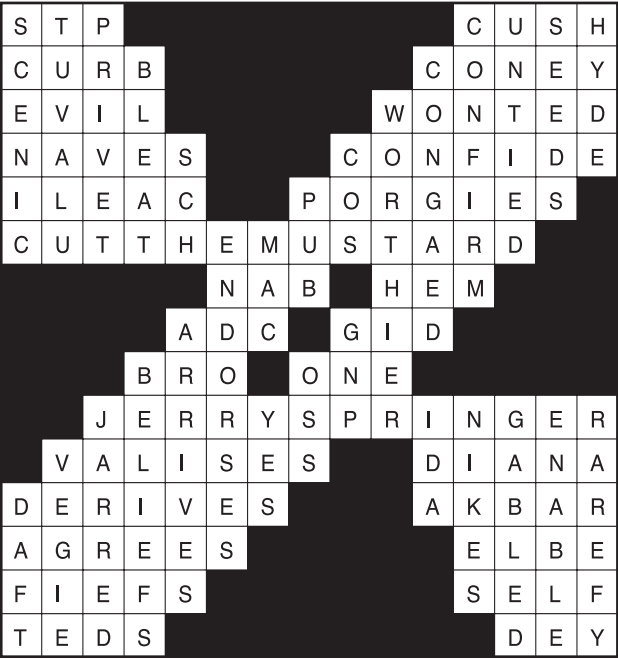

the resources we need to rebuild and recover from this global health emergency.”

The legislation features a number of Rep. Delgado’s priorities, including:

- \$179 billion for local governments and \$20.69 billion for New York State. The local funding is distributed using the formula in Rep. Delgado’s bill, the Direct Support for Communities Act, a bipartisan, bicameral proposal to ensure counties, cities, towns and villages of all sizes can access urgently needed federal funds.
- The Small Business Debt Relief Extension Act, which builds on Rep. Delgado’s Small Business Re-

payment Relief Act, which was signed into law as part of the bipartisan CARES Act. Delgado’s original bill provided \$17 billion for automatic loan repayment for small businesses. His latest proposal extends those debt relief payments by 6, 12, or 18 months depending on the loan type. It ensures the benefit is not taxed as annual income and improves program integrity and transparency through increased outreach and reporting.

- The Prioritized Paycheck Protection Program (P4) Act. This legislation allows smaller businesses with significant losses due to COVID-19 to receive a second forgivable PPP loan.

The updated Heroes Act also encompasses multiple Delgado-backed bills:

- The RESTAURANTS Act, which creates a \$120 billion restaurant revitalization fund to provide grants to independent restaurants or drinking establishments, an industry particularly hard-hit by the pandemic. These grants will help cov-

er payroll, food, utilities, rent and more.

- The Save Our Stages (SOS) Act, which creates a \$10 billion grant program to provide grants to live venue operators, producers, promoters and talent representatives, another industry deeply impacted by COVID-19. The grants can be used for rent, utilities, mortgage, PPE procurement and more.

In addition to Rep. Delgado’s priorities, the legislation passed by the House today includes a second round of stimulus checks for working families across the country. The bill also provides unemployment benefits, supplemental funding to expand COVID testing and tracing, resources for supplemental nutrition assistance, federal funds for rural housing, block grants to invest in rural broadband, federal dollars to support mental health resources, and more. DEC Asks Bowhunters to Report Deer that May Have Died from EHD

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) asks bowhunters who may encounter deer affected by Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease (EHD) this fall to report the find to DEC. EHD is a viral disease of whitetail deer that cannot be contracted by humans. Reports from hunters help DEC track the disease’s potential spread.

Archery seasons for whitetail deer and black bear began Thursday, Oct. 1, in the Southern Zone and more hunters will be in remote forests, fields, and waterways and may come

across deer that died of EHD. Hunters are encouraged to report any deer suspected of dying from EHD to the nearest DEC regional wildlife office. A directory is available on the DEC website.

DEC wildlife biologists have been receiving reports of dead and sick deer this fall and collected carcasses for testing at DEC’s Wildlife Health Unit in Delmar, Albany County. Tissue samples have been sent to the Animal Health Diagnostic Center at Cornell University to confirm the presence of EHD.

To date, EHD has been confirmed in portions of Dutchess, Greene, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Ulster, and Westchester counties, and DEC has received reports of approximately 750 dead deer. Though the current outbreak appears concentrated in the lower Hudson Valley, EHD may have spread elsewhere in New York.

While EHD outbreaks can remove a number of deer from a localized population, they do not have a significant long-term impact on deer populations. Deer populations throughout the currently impacted region are robust. DEC does not plan to reduce harvest in areas affected by EHD at this time.

The EHD virus is carried by biting midges, small bugs often called no-see-ums or ‘punkies.’ Outbreaks are most common in the late summer and early fall when the midges that carry the virus are abundant. Once infected with EHD, deer usually die within 36 hours. The disease is not spread from deer to deer or from deer to humans. Symptoms in deer include fever, hemorrhage in muscles or organs, and swelling of the head, neck, tongue, and lips. A deer infected with EHD may appear lame or dehydrated. Frequently, infected deer will seek out water sources and many succumb to the disease near a water source. There is no treatment for nor means to prevent EHD. The dead deer do not serve as a source of infection for other animals.

The EHD virus affected New York deer in 2007 in Albany, Rensselaer, and Niagara counties, and in Rockland County in 2011.

EHD is endemic in southern states where there are annual outbreaks, so some southern deer have developed immunity. Generally, in the northeast, EHD outbreaks occur sporadically and deer in New York have no immunity to this virus. Consequently, most EHD-infected deer in New York are expected to die. In the north, the first hard frost kills the midges that transmit the disease, ending the EHD outbreak.

Hunters should not handle or eat any deer that appears sick or acts strangely. DEC continues to monitor the EHD outbreak. In addition, the State Department of Agriculture and Markets has alerted deer farmers and veterinarians throughout the state to be aware of the disease and to report suspicious cases.

Set the mood for a natural Halloween while learning about bats! Each year, Bat Week provides a focus on bats, their life history, and

conservation efforts. This year, Bat Week will be held Oct. 24-31.

New York state is home to nine species of bats. They are found all over the state, including New York City. Three species migrate to warmer locations for the winter and the others hibernate during the coldest months. You can learn more about NY’s bats by downloading the DEC bat bro-



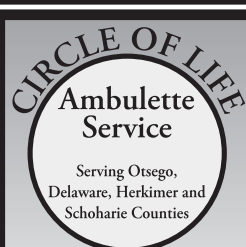
the Career Destinations - Connecting Students to Local Jobs and Careers program to 14 middle and high schools in Delaware, Otsego, and Chenango counties.

DEC Reminds Fall Campers to Follow Firewood Requirements to Prevent the Spread of Invasive Species

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) marked the beginning of fall camping season by reminding New Yorkers and visitors to prevent the spread of damaging invasive species by following state firewood requirements when obtaining wood for campfires. In recognition of October as National Firewood Awareness Month, DEC is releasing new PSA across the state to help raise awareness about firewood movement and its role in spreading invasive species.

“An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure’ and this is just as true for mitigating the damaging effects of invasive species as it is for staying healthy,” DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos said. “One of the easiest ways to prevent the spread of invasive forest pests is to obtain firewood within 50 miles of your destination. Whether you are setting out for a camping adventure or preparing to heat your house this winter, it is

Provide Wildflower Habitat for Pollinators this Fall

Fall-blooming asters and goldenrods provide important habitat for pollinators. Many of these beautiful flowers thrive in sunny fields, roadsides, and woodland openings while a few prefer partial shade.

At home, simple changes to your lawn, garden, and landscaping can help increase and improve fall pollinator habitat. In the garden, try planting native seed mixes or leaving a few goldenrod stems instead of weeding them out.

In the yard, choose to be pesticide-free and consider leaving no-mow edges or patches in your lawn to grow over time. Encouraging a diversity of native asters, goldenrods, and other fall-blooming plants provides a pop of color into October. It also provides pollen and nectar for bees, butterflies, and other invertebrates. After the blooms

important to use firewood grown nearby to protect the places you love.”

Many people take wood from their properties as they head out to camp, hunt, or enjoy the great outdoors, but most don’t realize their wood may be hiding the eggs, larvae, spores, adults, or even seeds of invasive threats. Transporting infested firewood allows invasives to spread further and faster than these pests could or would have on their own.

In 2009, New York State enacted a regulation to prevent this accidental and often long-distance spread by limiting the transportation of firewood. The regulation pertains to all species of wood, cut or not cut, split or not split, destined for use as fuel. Logs are subject to the regulation if their intended use is as firewood.

- Untreated firewood may not be imported into New York from any other state or country.
- Untreated firewood grown in New York may not be transported more than 50 miles (linear distance) from its source or origin unless it has been heat-treated to 71° C (160° F) for 75 minutes.
- * Origin is where the wood was grown.

DEC Seeks Public Input on Proposed Endangered Species Protections

DEC is accepting public comment on a revised regulatory proposal to strengthen protections for threatened and endangered wildlife in New York. The proposal promotes sharing information between landowners and DEC staff during permit reviews for projects on lands where endangered or threatened species may be located, helping improve the pace of permit decisions and to better avoid negative impacts to vulnerable wildlife populations. Since first proposed in 2019, DEC revised the proposal to better clarify ongoing federal authority in protecting listed

endangered and threatened species.

Also, the proposed regulation revisions allow DEC to establish an experimental population outside the current range for any endangered or threatened species to help enable its recovery. DEC will post proposed experimental population designations for public review and will not remove any species protections already in place.

The revised regulatory proposal is titled “Part 182, Clarifying determination of jurisdiction under the Endangered and Threatened Fish and Wildlife regulations” and is available at DEC’s website, <https://www.dec.ny.gov/regulations/34113.html>.

Signs your gutters are in need of repair

Fall is a great time to tackle projects around the house. The weather each fall allows homeowners to make improvements to their homes' exteriors without worrying about extreme heat or cold, while interior projects like painting are made easier because homeowners can open the windows to allow for proper ventilation.

Fall also marks a great time to prepare for upcoming projects that can make winter work that much easier. For example, fall is a great time to take stock of your gutters so you can address any issues before leaves begin to fall or the first snowstorm touches down. Compromised gut-

ters can contribute to water issues in basements and adversely affect a home's foundation if not addressed immediately, so it behooves homeowners to learn the signs that gutters are in need of repair or replacement.

- Gutter hanging off the home: Gutters were once installed predominantly with spikes. However, many industry professionals now install gutters with hanger brackets. Why the change? Spikes loosen over time, leading to the gutters hanging off the home. That can contribute to serious issues if left untreated. Gutters hanging off the home need not necessarily be replaced, but rather se-

cured to the home, ideally with hanger brackets instead of spikes. Brackets hook into the front of the gutter and are then screwed into the fascia of a home. A professional who specializes in gutter repair can perform this task relatively quickly,



and it's an inexpensive yet highly effective solution.

- Gutter separation: Gutters that are no longer fastened together can leak and contribute to issues that affect the home's foundation, siding and appearance.

Clogs and the accumulation of debris can cause gutters to separate because they are not designed to hold too much weight. Replacement of separated gutters may or may not be necessary depending on how big the problem is and the

What to do to prepare your garden for winter

Gardens provide an idyllic escape from the hustle and bustle of everyday life. In fact, many gardening enthusiasts typically cannot wait for the spring thaw so they can spend the next several months tending to their plants under the warm sun. But a gardener's work is never truly done, and the work to make gardens stun in the spring actually begins during the preceding fall.

Preparing gardens for winter is an important step that can help homeowners ensure their gardens return to full strength in the spring. The tasks necessary to prepare gardens for winter may depend on what homeowners are planting, but the following are some general maintenance suggestions that can keep gardens safe this winter.

imperative that weeds and debris are removed before the ground hardens in winter. Don't wait until the ground hardens, as that can make it hard to remove the roots of weeds, adversely affecting the garden as a result.

- Prepare the soil. The Farmer's Almanac advises homeowners to gently till the soil in their gardens so they can expose any insects before they settle in for the winter. Once garden soil is exposed, add a layer of compost, leaves, aged manure, and, if necessary, lime, gently tilling it into the soil. According to the North Carolina Cooperative Extension, the only accurate way to determine if lawn or garden soil needs lime is to test it. Lime makes soil less acidic and reduces soil pH. Low soil pH makes it hard for certain



- Remove weeds and debris. Weeds and debris are unsightly and detrimental to plant life in spring, but they also can be harmful in the winter. Weeds and debris left to linger in gardens through the winter provide overwintering spots for insects and can contribute to disease. So it's

plants to grow, but acidic soil is ideal when growing blueberries. Test the soil for lime and amend it depending on what you hope to grow in the spring so it's ready to thrive when winter ends.

- Remove dead or diseased plants. Dead or diseased plants should

- Protect fruit trees. If you have fruit trees, install mouse guards around the base to prevent mice and voles from killing the trees over the winter. If left to their own

devices over the winter, mice and voles may eat the bark of fruit trees, killing the trees as a result. The Farmer's Almanac notes that mouse guards made of fine mesh hardware cloth can effectively protect fruit trees from hungry mice and voles over the winter.



Delgado Announces Federal Grant Funding to Support STEM-Focused Distance Learning

U.S. Representative An-

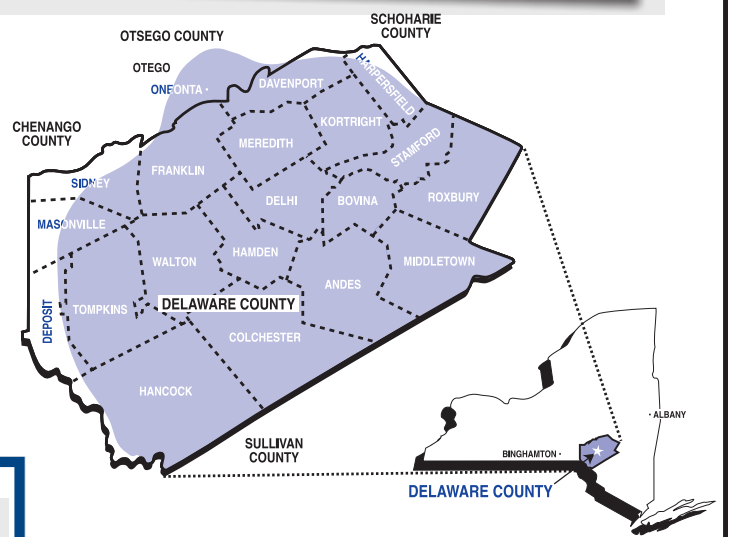

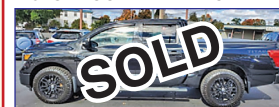
