### **House Passes Coronavirus Relief Legislation with Delgado Measures** to Support Small **Businesses** and State and Local Governments

Thursday, U.S. Representative Antonio Delgado (NY-19) voted for a revised coronavirus relief package based largely on the Heroes Act, legislation that passed the House in May but has yet to be considered in the Senate.

This latest proposal includes a number of priorities championed by the Congressman to bring urgently needed assistance to communities across New York's 19th Congressional District. The text has Rep. Delgado's Small Business Debt Relief Extension Act to automatically extend repayment measures for

qualified SBA loans, as well as his Prioritized Paycheck Protection Program or P4 Act, which allows the hardest hit businesses to apply for additional PPP funding. The bill also includes Rep. Delgado's Direct Support for Communities Act, which creates a distribution formula for state and local funding to ensure that all localities, regardless of size, receive direct federal support.

"Throughout this pandemic, I've visited communities all across the district and heard the same theme from my conversations with small business owners, family farmers, educators, and local officials: our nation needs assistance,

now," said Rep. Delgado. "I am particularly proud that this legislative package incorporates three bills I introduced, including Small Business Debt Relief Extension Act, and the Prioritized Paycheck Protection Program Act to provide small businesses with automatic loan repayment and renewed access to PPP funding. Importantly, this bill also utilizes my Direct Support for Communities Act to ensure that the \$238 billion in state funding and \$179 billion in local funding is distributed to communities of all sizes, including those upstate. I will keep pushing, every single day, as long as it takes, to get our region





### **DEC Asks Bowhunters to** Report Deer that May Have Died from

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) asks bowhunters who may encounter deer affected by Epizootic Hemorrhagic Disease (EHD) this fall to report the find to DEC. EHD is a viral disease of whitetail deer that cannot be contracted by humans. Reports from hunters help DEC track the disease's potential spread.

Archery seasons for whitetail deer and black bear began Thursday, Oct. 1, in the Southern Zone and more hunters will be in remote forests, fields, and waterways and may come

across deer that died of EHD. Hunters are encouraged to report any deer suspected of dying from EHD to the nearest DEC regional wildlife office. A directory is available on the DEC website.

DEC wildlife biologists have been receiving reports of dead and sick deer this fall and collected carcasses for testing at DEC's Wildlife Health Unit in Delmar, Albany County. Tissue samples have been sent to the Animal Health Diagnostic Center at Cornell University to confirm the presence of EHD.

To date, EHD has been confirmed in portions of Dutchess, Greene, Orange, Putnam, Rockland, Ulster, and Westchester counties, and DEC has received reports of approximately 750 dead deer. Though the current outbreak appears concentrated in the lower Hudson Valley, EHD may have spread elsewhere in New York.

While EHD outbreaks can remove a number of deer from a localized population, they do not have a significant long-term impact on deer populations. Deer populations throughout the currently impacted region are robust. DEC does not plan to reduce harvest in areas affected by EHD at this time.

The EHD virus is carried by biting midges, small bugs often called no-see-ums or 'punkies.' Outbreaks are most common in the late summer and early fall when the midges that carry the virus are abundant. Once infected with EHD, deer usually die within 36 hours. The disease is not spread from deer to deer or from deer to humans. Symptoms in deer include fever, hemorrhage in muscles or organs, and swelling of the head, neck, tongue, and lips. A deer infected with EHD may appear lame or dehydrated. Frequently, infected deer will seek out water sources and many succumb to the disease near a water source. There is no treatment for nor means to prevent EHD. The dead deer do not serve as a source of infection for other animals.

The EHD virus affected New York deer in 2007 in Albany, Rensselaer, and Niagara counties, and in

ern states where there are annual outbreaks, so some southern deer have developed immunity. Generally, in the northeast, EHD outbreaks occur sporadically and deer in New York have no immunity to this virus. Consequently, most EHDinfected deer in New York are expected to die. In the north, the first hard frost kills the midges that transmit the disease, ending the

Hunters should not handle or eat any deer that appears sick or acts strangely. DEC continues to monitor the EHD outbreak. In addition, the State Department of Agriculture and Markets has alerted deer farmers and veterinarians throughout the state to be aware of the disease and to report



DEC is accepting public comment on a revised regulatory proposal to strengthen protections for threatened and endangered wildlife in New York. The proposal promotes sharing information between landowners and DEC staff during permit reviews for projects on lands where endangered or threatened species may be located, helping improve the pace of permit decisions and to better avoid negative impacts to vulnerable wildlife populations. Since first proposed in 2019, DEC revised the proposal to better clarify ongoing federal authority in protecting listed

endangered and threatened species.

Also, the proposed regulation revisions allow DEC to establish an experimental population outside the current range for any endangered or threatened species to help enable its recovery. DEC will post proposed experimental population designations for public review and will not remove any species protections already in place.

The revised regulatory proposal is titled "Part 182, Clarifying determination of jurisdiction under the Endangered and Threatened Fish and Wildlife regulations" and is available at DEC's website, https:// www.dec.ny.gov/regulations/34113.html.

of Invasive Species The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) marked the beginning of fall camping season by reminding New Yorkers and visitors to prevent the spread of damaging invasive species by following state firewood requirements when obtaining wood for campfires. In recognition of October as National Firewood Awareness Month, DEC is releasing new PSA across the state to help raise awareness about firewood movement and its role in spreading invasive species.

"An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure' and this is just as true for mitigating the damaging effects of invasive species as it is for staying healthy," DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos said. "One of the easiest ways to prevent the spread of invasive forest pests is to obtain firewood within 50 miles of your destination. # Signs your gutters are in need of repair

Fall is a great time to tackle projects around the house. • Gutter separation: Gutters that are no longer fastened together can leak and contribute to issues that affect the home's foundation, siding and appearance. condition of the existing gutters. If replacement is not necessary, separated gutters may be remedied by securing the joints, another relatively simple and inexpensive fix.

- Peeling exterior paint: Paint that appears to be peeling off of your home may indicate that water is seeping over the edge of the gutter closest to your home. When that happens, water is coming down the side of the house, causing the paint to peel. In such instances, replacing the gutters is often necessary.
- · Basement flooding: Not all signs of deteriorating gutters are outside a home. Many a homeowner has been flummoxed by flooding in their basements, and such flooding can be caused by aging, ineffective gutters. That's because deteriorating gutters sometimes allow water to leak near the foundation of a home, contributing to basement flooding.

Fall is an ideal time to inspect gutters and have any issues fixed before leaves begin to fall or harsh winter weather arrives.

# What to do to prepare your garden for winter

Once garden soil is exposed, add a layer of compost, leaves, aged manure, and, if necessary, lime, gently tilling it into the soil. According to the North Carolina Cooperative Extension, the only accurate way to determine if lawn or garden soil needs lime is to test it. Lime makes soil less acidic and reduces soil pH. Low soil pH makes it hard for certain



• Remove weeds and debris. Weeds and debris are unsightly and detrimental to plant life in spring, but they also can be harmful in the winter. Weeds and debris left to linger in gardens through the winter provide overwintering spots for insects and can contribute to disease. So it's

plants to grow, but acidic soil is ideal when growing blueberries. Test the soil for lime and amend it depending on what you hope to grow in the spring so it's ready to thrive when winter ends.







\* Source is for producers of firewood to help account for wood from different origins that may become comingled as the firewood is processed. Producers must maintain records of where

they acquire wood from and ensure the origins are within 50 miles of the source, which is usually the address of their business.

• When transporting firewood, the following documentation is required:

\* If transporting untreated firewood cut for personal use (i.e. not for sale) fill out a Self-Issued Certificate of Origin (PDF).

\* If purchasing and transporting untreated firewood, it must have a receipt or label that identifies the firewood source. Consumers need to use the source to determine how far the firewood may be transported.

\* If purchasing and transporting heat-treated firewood, it must have a receipt or label that says, "New York Approved Heat-Treated Firewood/Pest Free." This is the producers' declaration that the firewood meets New York's heat-treatment

requirements. Most "kilndrying" processes meet the standard, but not all, so it is important to look for the appropriate label. Heat-treated firewood may be moved unrestricted.

Some invasive pests of concern and their respective hosts:

- Asian longhorned beetle - maple, birch, ash, sycamore, poplar, willow, elm, hackberry, mountain ash, horse-chestnut;
- Oak wilt oak, especially red oak:
- Emerald ash borer all ash species (white, black, green);
- Asian gypsy moth more than 500 hosts includ-

ing oak, basswood, birch. poplar, alder, willow, larch, hemlock, pine, and spruce;

- Light brown apple moth apple, oak, pine, poplar, walnut; and
- · Brown spruce longhorned beetle - spruce.

Any law enforcement officer can enforce this regulation and violations may result in a ticket that carries a \$250 fine in addition to other penalties. Untreated firewood moved more than 50 miles may be ordered to be returned to its source/ origin or confiscated and destroyed. Failing to follow the regulation could also lead to greater impacts well beyond a ticket fee, such as:

· the death of trees in favorite campgrounds and neighborhoods;

• the loss of trees and forest habitats critical to many species of wildlife including rare, threatened, and en-

dangered species; · untold ecological impacts from the loss of entire species (akin to the loss of American chestnut or American elm);

· millions of dollars to remove infested or dead trees from campgrounds, yards, parks, playgrounds, and community streets; and

• millions of dollars in liability exposure for public and private property owners from dead and continued on page 9







ing the ONC BOCES facilities soon and seeing this new equipment in use." "The USDA Rural Utili-

ties Service grant provides expanded STEM-focused distance learning opportunities for students in our region. In addition to robust course offerings that prepare our students for college and the workforce, the grant provides funding for remote training in opioid addiction and overdose prevention for community members, school staff, and emergency personnel. This grant expands our regional capacity to provide opportunities to our students and we are grateful to the USDA for providing this funding," said Dr. Catherine Huber, District Superintendent, ONC BOCES.

The Distance Learning and Telemedicine Grant program at USDA Rural Development is designed to help rural communities use the unique capabilities of telecommunications to connect to each other and to the world. ### Hike Smart this Fall

Before you hit the trail on your next outdoor adventure, be sure to check out DEC's Hike Smart NY page, https://www.dec. ny.gov/outdoor/28708. html, to learn about safety, best practices, and preparedness. While recreatng on state lands, please follow the Hiker Responsibility Code and avoid busy trailheads. Discover trails less traveled and visit at a time when trails may not be as busy.

Review regulations. Before you head to your next hiking destination, take a moment to review the rules and regulations for the area you will be visiting. Each state land property has rules in place to help protect visitors and the natural resources of the site.

Be prepared. Trails are

wet and muddy in areas. Wear waterproof shoes and walk through mud, not around it, to protect trail edges. Seasonal temperatures are dropping, and temperatures are even lower on high summits. Many exposed summits are windy. When you check the weather, be prepared you could encounter ice or snow at high elevations this time of year. Wear appropriate base layers, bring waterproof and windproof outer layers, and pack extra base layers and socks. If conditions become unfavorable. turn around. You can always complete your hike another day. Be respectful of hunters.

Most small game and some waterfowl and big game hunting seasons are open. Hikers should be aware that they may meet hunters bearing firearms or archery equipment while hiking on trails. Recognize that these are fellow outdoor recreationists with the legal right to participate in these

activities in areas where it is permitted. Hunting accidents involving non-hunters are extremely rare. Hikers should choose to wear bright colors as an extra precaution.

Manage your time wisely. Be mindful of sunrise and sunset times and plan accordingly. Start long hikes early to ensure you will have enough sunlight to finish before dark, and always bring a headlamp. Check the approximate sunset time before you hit the road.


