#### Delgado Introduces Bill Providing Student Loan Relief to Revitalize Rural Areas

WASHINGTON, DC – This week, U.S. Representative Antonio Delgado (NY-19) and Rep. Abby Finkenauer (IA-01) introduced the Rural Revitalization Now Act to provide up to \$50,000 in student loan relief for people who commit to live and work in rural communities for at least eight years.

"Upstate New York is home to some of the best colleges in the world, but our towns and villages continue to see students move to metropolitan areas after graduation rather than build their lives in rural communities. A key component of that is the overlyburdensome student debt that forces young people to look for work elsewhere," said Rep. Delgado. "Today, I'm introducing legislation focused on attracting and retaining young people in rural communities by providing student loan relief to those who work and live in rural areas experiencing population loss. The Rural Revitalization Now Act will help ease the burden of student loan debt and encourage folks to settle down, find employment, and raise a family here in upstate." "Rural depopulation has been a fact of life in Iowa and across the country for decades - diminishing economic opportunity and undermining quality of life. It's heartbreaking to see, but it doesn't have to be this way," Rep. Abby Finkenauer said. "The Rural Revitalization Now Act will allow young professionals to move back home, create new opportunities and find a real sense of community - while also relieving their student loan debt and building on their future." The Rural Revitalization Now Act creates a program that would provide borrowers with student debt relief on their federal or private student loans if they live in a very rural area, a small or mid-sized community that is losing population, or a community that has been affected by a major disaster. The program would allow states, counties, localities, territories, Tribes, nonprofit entities, and qualifying partnerships to sponsor borrowers, in conjunction with the federal government, by providing student debt relief of up to \$50,000 over eight years. 

sponsors would generally split the cost of debt forgiveness with the federal government, although the program is flexible and allows sponsors to bear less of the cost if needed.

To be eligible for student loan relief under the Rural Revitalization Now Act, a borrower must live in a qualifying area that meets certain requirements both individually and considered collectively with any other city or town that is adjacent to or closely associated with it. To be a qualifying area, a city or town must have:

Less than 20,000 people

• Less than 100,000 people and have lost population over the last 10 years

based on potential economic benefit for the area.





#### Help Prevent Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease from Harming New York's Rabbits and Hares

Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) is a fatal virus that affects rabbits and hares. A new strain, RHDV2, was identified in 2010. In 2020, RHDV2 jumped to wild rabbits and hares in the southwestern U.S., where it spread to six states within four months. The virus can infect wild rabbits and hares, in addition to domestic rabbits. RHDV2 is extremely hardy, easily transmitted, and highly lethal to rabbits and hares. It does not infect humans or other animals like dogs or cats. RHDV2 spreads easily through direct contact between rabbits or contact with contaminated environments or objects. The most likely routes of introduction to New York are through transported domestic rabbits, internationally imported rabbit products, or people who travel to outbreak areas in the southwest. Below are ways you can help stop the spread: • If you keep domestic rabbits, prevent intermingling with other rabbits. If you get new rabbits, quarantine them for two weeks and use separate equipment and clothing to care for them. • If you are a wildlife rehabilitator who cares for wild rabbits, do not keep domestic rabbits as pets or have contact with domestic rabbits; maintain good disinfection techniques and change PPE between rabbit litters or individual rabbits. • If you are a rabbit or hare hunter, avoid contact with domestic rabbits, and do not bring rabbit carcasses killed in other states to New York. • If you are a hiker, camper, or traveler, and you have been to known RHDV2 outbreak areas in Colorado, southern Califor-



nia, Arizona, New Mexico, Utah and western Texas, disinfect footwear with a 10 percent bleach solution (1 part household bleach, 9 parts water) before going afield in New York.

• Please report any unusual wild rabbit mortalities you encounter to the DEC Wildlife Health Unit at (518) 478-2203.





656, Fragale overcame a myriad of obstacles associated with the current COVID-19 pandemic for his shot at playing professional. For starters, his senior season was cut short shortly after he and the Broncos secured a 70-56 first-round win over Holy Family in the USCAA National Tournament to advance to the Final Four. The USCAA National Tournament was something Fragale and his teammates set their sights on since freshman year. Like everyone else, all the team could do was group together, call it season, and focus on finishing the semester strong. Fragale continued to complete his bachelor's degree in Recreation and Sports Management when the opportunity in the PBL presented itself.

After attending showcases in Las Vegas and Atlanta over the summer, Fragale signed with Top 5 Sports Management. The opportunity to join the PBL arrived when he participated in fellow Western New York league member Rochester Razorsharks' combine. Fragale was invited to join their training camp before ultimately signing with Buffalo. The green and gold's number 23 for four seasons is the latest Bronco under Coach Thomsen to secure a professional

Kaegel received 183 votes from the 374 ballots, including three blanks, cast by BBWAA members with 10 or more consecutive years' service, in becoming the 72nd winner of the award since its inception in 1962 and named for the first recipient. Spink was a driving force of the Sporting News, known during his lifetime as the "Baseball Bible." The late Marty Noble, a staple of New York press boxes for more than four decades, received 115 votes. Allan Simpson, the former minor-league executive who founded the influential publication Baseball America, got 73.

For versatility over a career spanning 53 years, Kaegel may have had no peer. In addition to his coverage of the St. Louis Cardinals and the Kansas City Royals, he served as editor-in-chief of the Sporting News, where circulation spiked during his stewardship from 1979-85. He spent one spring as a player to inform readers about his experience. And in an amazing feat of endurance, Kaegel covered all 162 games of the Royals' season in 2011, just four years after undergoing liver transplant surgery. Kaegel's career took him from the bi-weekly Granite City (Ill.) Press Record in 1964 to coverage of the Cardinals for the St. Louis Post Dispatch for 12 years and a more than two-decade stint of Royals coverage for the Kansas City Star and MLB.com. One spring for the Sporting News, he worked out with the Baltimore Orioles of Frank Robinson, Brooks Robinson and Jim Palmer and filed weekly reports. Kaegel edited the magazine with reverence for the game and kept box scores for the entirety of his tenure, a feat of which he is still proud. Kaegel served several terms as chair of the Kansas City Chapter of the BBWAA and twice served on the Hall of Fame's Golden Era Committee. His wire-to-wire coverage of the Royals in 2011 remains a staggering achievement for any baseball writer.


