



Guides Program Exams to be Held Online

for NYS Licensed

The State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) announced that examinations are scheduled for individuals seeking to become licensed guides in New York state. The exams being offered are for guiding in the following categories: camping; fishing; hiking; hunting; whitewater; rock climbing; ice climbing; and certified skilled with boats

and canoes. A guide is a person at least 18 years of age who offers services for hire, part or all of which include directing, instructing, or aiding another individual in fishing, hunting, camping, hiking, whitewater rafting/ canoeing/kayaking, or rock and ice climbing.

To provide enhanced access to examinations for applicants, DEC is offering licensed guide examinations online in 2022. Exam dates and application deadlines are:

Feb. 4, 2022 - 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. (Registration must be received by Jan. 28, 2022)

March 5, 2022 - New York State Outdoor Guides Association (NYSOGA) meeting only (Registration must be received by Feb. 26, 2022). In addition, inperson examinations will be offered at the NYSOGA winter rendezvous on Mar. 5, 2022.

April 8, 2022 - 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. (Registration must be received by April 1, 2022)

May 13, 2022 - 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. (Registration must be received by May 6, 2022)

June 17, 2022 - 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. (Registration must be received by June 10, 2022)

Sept. 16, 2022 - 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. (Registration must be received by Sept. 9, 2022)

Oct. 14, 2022 - 8 a.m. to 11 p.m. (Registration must be received by Oct. 7, 2022)

The registration deadline for exams is seven days before the examination. Instructions and registration information about the exams can be found at dec. ny.gov/permits/30969. html.



IDA Requests NYC Suspend Further Land Acquisition in DelCo

DELHI - The Delaware County Industrial Development Agency board of directors unanimously passed a resolution requesting New York City (NYC) Department of Environmental Protection suspend its planned expansion of land acquisition with a streamside acquisition program, in support of the county's Board of Supervisors' similar resolution passed Oct. 27, at its Dec. 17 monthly meeting.

The resolution calls on NYC to develop a new 10year land acquisition plan that includes findings of the National Academies Expert Panel which reflect a change in circumstances since the City was granted a filtration avoidance determination in 2007 under a water supply permitting process. The IDA is asking NYC to refrain from entering into any new contracts to purchase land or conservation easement under its existing land acquisition program devised to protect water quality.

Instead of land acquisition, the IDA is asking the City to limit land and conservation easement acquisition to flood mitigation projects, stream protection/management projects, a Delaware County Alternative Pilot Land Acquisition Proposal and a voluntary municipally approved streamside acquisition program. IDA Chairperson James Thomson said it is important that all Delaware County elected officials, agencies and organizations present a "unified front" against a proposed streamside acquisition program in addition to the existing land $acquisition\ program\ which$ has damaged Delaware County's economy.

The resolution, Thomson said, points out that there are already programs in place through the county's soil and water conservation district and other organizations that protect streamside property and water quality. The IDA's hope, Thomson said, is

that ownership of Delaware County property will remain in the hands of local property owners.

"We want the City to abandon the proposed Streamside Acquisition Program because we've already got streamside protection programs in place," Thomson clarified.

Rather than further City land purchases, the IDA suggests the City implement a program similar to the USDA's CREP (Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program), administered by Delaware County Soil & Water Conservation District, which allows property owners to keep title to their land while receiving payment from the City for conservation practices.

As part of the resolution, the IDA is additionally requesting that potential adverse impacts of the proposed streamside acquisition program on municipalities be identified and evaluated including concerns about:

- Installation and upgrade of electrical, water, gas, telephone, broadband/cable lines as needed to provide basic utilities.
- Maintenance, upgrade, expansion, widening, safety improvements to existing roads and extension of existing roads.
- Installation, expansion, and replacement of communication towers (including the necessary utilities).
- The siting, maintenance, and expansion of stream crossings.
- Flood mitigation proj-
- Renewable Energy Projects.

The resolution was sent to state and federal elected official, the New York State Department of Health, the **Environmental Protection** Agency, the New York City Department of Environmental Protection and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.



Stop Eye Strain Before It Starts


It's that time of the year when many areas of the country are under the cold cloak of winter. Unforgiving temperatures can translate

into an increase in hours spent indoors, whether at work or at home, and more time relying on devices to pass the hours.

friends, or browsing the internet can lead to a condition known as "computer vision eye strain." Eye strain also may be caused through intense eye use, such as while driving long distances or engaging in activities that require close attention, such as crafting or reading.

The American Optometric Association says digital eye strain can result in various forms of discomfort, which increase with the amount of screen use. The most common symptoms include:

- headaches;
- blurred vision;
- · dry, watery or burning eyes;
- · increased sensitivity to
- light; and • neck and shoulder pain.

The AOA says viewing a computer or digital screen often makes the eyes have to work harder. The AOA notes this is different from reading a printed page. The letters are not as precise or sharply defined, and areas of contrast can be muted. Also, the presence of glare and reflections on the screen may make viewing difficult. Furthermore, the Mayo Clinic says people tend to blink less while using digital devices, and view them at less than ideal distances or angles.

Alleviating eye strain from digital sources involves making changes in daily habits or the environment. Taking regular eye breaks, and looking at objects from different distances can help them focus. These tips may help as well.

- Adjust the lighting to reduce glare on screens or your task.
- Limit screen time as much as possible and engage in other activi-
- · Consider the use of artificial tears products to lubricate dry eyes.
- Choose the right eyewear, and work with an eye professional to find products that can assist you. Specialized glasses or contact lenses are designed for computer work. Investigate tintings and coatings that also may help.
- Blink often to refresh the eyes.
- Talk to a doctor if eye strain persists or changes in severity.

When the weather gets cold, people may rely on digital devices for recreation more than they otherwise would. Avoiding eye strain in such situations can help people avoid discomfort.

NYS Division Of Consumer Protection and **Public Service Alerts Consumers Of Utility Company Scammers**

Scammers Claim Utilities Will be Shut Off **Unless Consumer Makes Payment**

The New York State Division of Consumer Protection (DCP) and the NYS Department of Public Service alerts consumers of phone calls in which scammers pretending to be from electric companies are looking for overdue payments and threatening to suspend electricity unless they receive a payment immediately. Payment has been requested by means of untraceable services such as gift cards and money transfer apps, including PayPal and Zelle.

The calls reported to DCP are coming from scammers purporting to be from New York electric and gas utilities. The scammers claim that the consumers' utilities will be shut off in minutes due to an outstanding account balance unless the consumer makes immediate payment. The scammer then asks for consumer information, including utility account numbers, social security numbers, and dates of birth, and demands payment for alleged past-due bills. Scammers will demand payment, in form of financial technologies, which includes cash apps and bitcoin, to bilk thousands of dollars from

unsuspecting costumers. Utilities give repeated notices prior to terminations including reaching out to consumers with past due balances by phone to offer payment options. However, utilities do not specify that the payment must be a prepaid card or other non-traceable money transfer. If someone demands payment via non-traceable method, consumers need to pull the plug and hang up the phone and reporting the

To avoid falling victim to these scams, consumers should llow the tips below:

- Hang up and call the utility company yourself using the number on your bill or the utility company's website even if the person who contacted you left a call back number. Often, those call-back numbers are fake. If the message came by text, don't respond. If your bill says you owe anything, pay it as you normally would, not as the caller says.
- · Consumers should never give out personal information such as account numbers. Social Security numbers, date of birth. mother's maiden names, passwords or other identifying information in response to unexpected calls or if they are suspicious. Consumers should not respond to any questions, especially those that can be answered with "Yes" or "No." Consumers should exercise caution if they are being pressured for information immediately.

• Utility companies do not ask for payments via gift cards or cash transfer apps. Gift cards allow scammers to get money without a trace. Real utility companies issue several disconnection warnings before shutting off utilities and they never demand money over the phone or specify a method of payment. The utility may call customers to discuss payment plans, but will NOT call the customers to threaten. The utility primarily communicates via letters, bills, emails and authorized texts.

- Use call blocking tools from your phone provider and check into apps that block calls. The FCC allows phone companies to block robocalls by default based on reasonable analytics (see fcc.gov/robocalls).
- Do not rely on the number that comes up on your phone. Callers can "spoof" the number to look like a government agency or local utility company. If someone has contacted an individual and they are suspicious, they should hang up and go directly to the official website for the agency or utility company or call the number on their utility bill to confirm whether there is a problem with their account.

File a complaint with the Division of Consumer Protection.

The New York State Division of Consumer Protection investigates Do Not Call violations and provides voluntary mediation between a consumer and a business when a consumer has been unsuccessful at reaching a resolution on their own. New Laws For The New Year

With the new year comes new laws that take effect Jan. 1, 2022. For New York, this includes a raise in the minimum wage, a food scraps recycling law, a ban on polystyrene foam and the final pieces to the paid family leave plan.

Minimum Wage

The statewide \$15 minimum hourly wage was enacted with the 2016–17 state budget and is being implemented with a series of increases. In New York state, the minimum wage will increase from \$12.50 to \$13.20 beginning Dec. 31. The minimum wage for employees in the fast food industry increased to \$15 July 1 across the state, according to the Department of Labor. New York City minimum wages increased more rapidly than the rest of the state, and all NYC businesses had a \$15 minimum wage beginning Dec. 31, 2019. Long Island and Westchester County will reach the \$15 minimum wage goal with the 2022 increase.

While minimum wage in the state has increased, it still falls short of a living wage which is the salary necessary for employees to live comfortably with basic needs. According to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology's living wage calculator, the living wage for a single adult with no dependents is \$14.26 in Delaware County, or \$29.652 annually. This calculation takes into account typical living costs like

Family Leave was signed into law in 2016 and began in 2018. It was rolled out over the course of four years, reaching the final stages in 2022. The program started out with eight weeks of paid family leave with 50% pay in 2018. The rollout of the program ends in 2022 with eligible employees having 12 weeks of job-protected, paid time off. The pay for this time off is 67% of the employee's usual pay up to a maximum of 67% of the Statewide Average Weekly Wage (SAWW). For 2022, this means the maximum paid leave is \$1,068.36 per

Paid family leave can be taken to care for a new child, care for a familv member with a serious health condition, to assist someone while a family member is deployed abroad on active military service, and, in some cases, for an employee or employee's child to quarantine or isolate due to CO-VID-19 exposure. While on paid leave, employees keep the same health insurance they had while working. Leave can be taken all at once, or in increments of full days. Paid leave is fully funded by employees through payroll deductions of .511% with a maximum deduction of \$423.71 annually for 2022.

Polystyrene Foam Ban

A ban on expanded polystyrene, single-use foam food and beverage containers and polystyrene packing peanuts will go into effect Jan. 1, 2022. The Expanded Polystyrene Foam Container and Polystyrene Loose Fill Packaging Ban was adopted in 2020 and is the country's most aggressive statewide polystyrene ban. Covered food service providers and retail and wholesale stores will no longer be able to distribute polystyrene foam containers or packing peanuts in New York state. Covered food service providers include any food service establishments defined by the New York State Sanitary Code, retail food stores, delis, grocery stores, restaurants, cafeterias, coffee shops, hospitals, adult care facilities, nursing homes, elementary and secondary schools, colleges and universities.

This ban does not apply to food that was packaged with polystyrene before it was received by the food service provider, the packaging of raw meat or seafood to be prepared offpremises by customers and containers made of rigid polystyrene resin.

Covered food service providers may submit a hardship waiver to the Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) if there is no alternative at a comparable cost, and purchasing an alternative would create undue financial hardship.

The state chose to ban polystyrene packaging because it is one of the most abundant materials in environmental litter, and it is not biodegradable, according to the DEC. It is also difficult to recycle and has low value, so it is not accepted at many recycling facilities.

Food Scraps Recycling

Beginning Jan. 1, 2022, all businesses and institutions that produce an average of two tons of food waste or more per week will be required to donate excess edible food and recycle inedible food scraps. Food waste in landfills contributes to methane production which is considered a greenhouse gas. Businesses and institutions will only be required to recycle food scraps if they are within 25 miles of an organics recycler.

The DEC published a list on June 1 of businesses and institutions that it has identified as designated food scrap generators (DFSG), and those businesses will have to donate and recycle food waste beginning Jan. 1, 2022. The DEC will identify DFSGs annually that will have to comply with this law Jan. 1 of the following year. In Delaware County, this includes the State University of New York College of Technology (SUNY) at Delhi.


This law does not apply to hospitals, nursing homes, adult care facilities, K-12 schools or farms. DF-SGs are required to donate as much of the excess food as possible by partnering with local food banks or similar organizations. FeedingNYS will provide assistance to DFSGs in making a donation plan.

Delaware County Portal to Report At-Home Positive COVID-19 Tests

Positive home tests are now able to be reported to the Delaware County Public Health Services. The home test reporting portal can be accessed on both the Delaware County website at https://www.delcony.us/ coronavirus/#ReportTest and on the Public Health website at http://delawarecountypublichealth.

The portal asks for basic demographic information and test kit information. Most home tests give results in about 15 minutes.

If you are positive isolate yourself. If you are infectious, you'll want to reduce the risk of passing it on to someone else. Positive individuals should let close contacts know about their potential exposure risk.






